# Section 3 - Hazards Identification

\*\*\* Emergency Overview \*\*\*: Contains Aromatic Distillate, which may cause cancer. Contents Under Pressure. Harmful if inhaled. # Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures

## Section 7 - Handling And Storage
